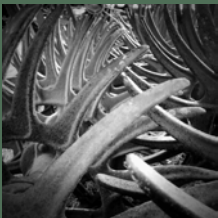
Muir Pavillion

Settlement, town and family history, lifestyle and domestic memorabilia.



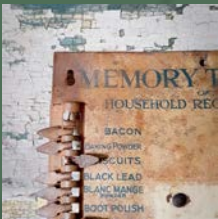
Blacksmith shop
